Series of training events for court coordinators  
in the European Union



## The Project

The project addresses the need for joint advanced training on EU law for court coordinators in European law (CCEs) by organising a series of legal seminars focusing on the latest developments concerning fundamental/human rights in the EU, the preliminary ruling procedure and EU citizenship.

The project will provide a platform for exchange of best practices, information and knowledge and create close contacts among CCEs from Member States that have active CCE networks.

The project consists of four pan-European legal seminars in English. It aims to train 150 CCEs from seven participating Member States: Bulgaria, Hungary, Italy, the Netherlands, Poland, Romania and Spain.

### **Participation**

Participation will be subject to a selection procedure by the supporting organisation or partner, since the number of places is limited. After being selected, you will need to register online on the ERA website in order to participate in the seminar.

### **Registration fee**

There is no registration fee.
