About the project

The project is a continuation of the similar project for court coordinators in European law (CCEs), which was implemented from 2019 till the end of 2021. It addresses again the need for joint advanced training on EU law for CCEs by organising a series of legal seminars focusing on application of EU law, fundamental / human rights (incl. the Charter and the rule of law) and the preliminary ruling procedure. This time Special focus will be put on the exchange of best practices, experience, information and knowledge among CCEs and the efforts will be made to continue creating close contacts among them.

The project consists of 6 pan-European legal seminars in English, planned until 2024. It aims to train 235 CCEs from seven participating Member States: Bulgaria, Hungary, Italy, the Netherlands, Poland, Romania and Spain. This edition will be open to 30 judicial trainers from all MS, in order to spread the idea of the CCEs networks.
