Participation will be subject to a <u>selection procedure</u> by the supporting organisation or partner, since the number of places is limited. In addition, you will need to register online on ERA website in order to participate in the seminar. We strongly advise you <u>not</u> to make any travel or accommodation arrangements before your registration is confirmed.

Registration fee

There is no registration fee.

Travel and accommodation

- Participants will receive a fixed contribution towards their travel and accommodation expenses and will be asked to book their own travel and accommodation (2 nights) after receiving a confirmation from ERA. The condition for payment of this contribution is to sign all attendance sheets at the event. No supporting documents are needed. The amount of the contribution will be determined by the EU unit cost calculation guidelines (https://ec.europa.eu/info/fundingtenders/opportunities/docs/2021-2027/common/guidance/unitcost-decision-travel_en.pdf). - The travel costs contribution is based on the distance from the participant's place of work to the seminar location and will not take account of the participant's actual travel costs. - Travel costs from outside Romania: participants can calculate the contribution to which they will be entitled on the European Commission website (https://era-comm.eu/go/calculator). - For those travelling within Romania, the contribution for travel is fixed at 16€ (for a distance between 50km and 400km). Please note that no contribution will be paid for travel under 50km. - The accommodation cost in Romania is set at 109 Euro/night. - Successful applicants will be sent the relevant claim form and information on how to obtain payment of the contribution to their expenses. Please note that no payment is possible if the registered participant cancels their participation for any reason.
